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## **Hydropower Rehabilitations, Dissolved Oxygen and Minimum Flow, Draft Environmental Statement Prepared by Corps**

NASHVILLE, TENN., April 10, 2008 – The Corps of Engineers, Nashville District has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (DEIS) titled: HYDROPOWER REHABILITATIONS, DISSOLVED OXYGEN, and MINIMUM FLOW at WOLF CREEK DAM, KENTUCKY and CENTER HILL AND DALE HOLLOW DAMS, TENNESSEE, March 2008. The U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service is a cooperating agency.

The intent of the DEIS is to provide National Environmental Policy Act coverage for changes that include, but are not limited to water quality, aquatic, riparian, and terrestrial habitat, recreation, water supply, flood storage, economics, hydropower production, and safety as a result of hydropower renovations and possible operational changes at Wolf Creek, Center Hill, and Dale Hollow Dams. The DEIS will cover cumulative effects and compliance with Section 106 of the Historic Preservation Act.
